



MABOPANE RESIDENTS GET THEIR TITLE DEEDS



NWHC officials together with Baagi Forum Concerned leaders and Mabopane Title Deeds Beneficiaries

The NWHC officials together with Baagi Forum Concerned leaders from Mabopane gathered to celebrate handing out Title Deeds to Mabopane residents on the 25th of November 2018 at Mabopane indoor sports hall.

The mandate of the programme was to issue out 20 title deeds to the residents of Mabopane but because of the unavailability of about 15 people who were supposed to receive title deeds the officials only managed to issue out 5 title deeds. "Although we did not issue out all the title deeds we managed to assist all those who had enquiries about their deed of grants", said Mr Mothibi who was part of the NWHC officials.

We got the opportunity to interview one of the people who received their title deed and this is what she had to say, "I am very pleased to have been part of such a great project because today I'm holding a full title to my house, and most importantly I was assisted with no charge. I'm overwhelmed with joy knowing that I secured myself the most important document", said Ms Maroesele.

The NWHC together with the department of Human Settlements has committed itself to fight the number of title deed backlog in North West. "I encourage everyone who holds his or her deed of

grant to come forth and submit them so that we can be able to assist. If you have lost your deed of grant or any supporting documents you are also encouraged to come forth and get assisted", said Ms Motshegwe. She furthermore pointed out that a title deed recognises the owner, which allows for the property to be passed on to family members in the event of death. The transfer of deeds to the rightful owners is a legal obligation, where all residents have access to their title deeds," she said.

Although there is a record of slow progress with the Title deed restoration project, the NWHC has committed itself to improve the process and assist home owners with their deed of grants.
